Mozambique experienced huge progress after its civil war ended in 1992. It has been the fastest growing, non-oil economy in sub-Saharan Africa in the last 15 years. However, this growth has not led to a corresponding reduction in poverty. Three out of 4 people in Mozambique live below the poverty line.

Access to even the most basic services, such as water, healthcare and schooling, is limited.

We share the country's ambition to transform itself from a poor and post-conflict nation to a thriving gateway of trade and investment in the region.
